What do we mean by "fear?"

- Anxiety
- Doubt
- Shyness
- Panic
- Tension
- Stress
 - We mean fear as we experience it.

Is fear a sin?

Is fear a sin?

It depends on the ACTIONS we take in light of it.

What does the Bible say about fear?

- It is often tied to our faith
- It was the root of serious actions that led to sin (Numbers 13-14; Peter's denial in Luke 22;)
- God often meets us in our fear
- God often calls us to something better while in the midst of our fear (Gideon)

- What did fear lead the people to do?
 - Bear a false report
 - Doubt their ability despite having heard from God
 - o "THEY live there" (the Nephilim)
 - Adopt a spirit of fear and complaining (Numbers 14:1-4)
 - Revolt against God (Numbers 14:11)

A question worth considering:

What moves us from fearful to fearless?

• A vision for something greater (i.e. Caleb and Joshua)

• An external power (i.e. Gideon and Moses)

 In BOTH cases, the common circumstance is the presence of the Lord! God's not calling us to DENY the challenges.

He's calling us to TRUST that He is bigger than the circumstance!

Macro-Bravery vs. Micro-Bravery

 Macro-Bravery: taking the big risks in life that we all come to expect

 i.e. applying for a new job, buying a home, going to war, defending your family, stopping a bully.

• Micro-Bravery:

the bravery it takes to make **the hard decisions** in the **little things** of everyday life that add up to **make all the difference** over the course of your life.

Micro-Bravery:

- dedication to being an encouragement
- devotion to God and hearing from the Spirit
- discipline in health and money
- learning to hear from God
- refusing to speak negatively of other people,

Micro-Bravery:

- boldness to have hard conversations
- willingness to forgive
- boldness to believe the promises of God
- being fully present with family and not just a body in the room
- o following through

Micro-Bravery:

- keeping your word
- dedication to relationships over your own personality
- not letting circumstances dictate your character.

One Big Takeaway

God, today, can take fearful people and make them fearless... because of Jesus.

With Moses, he said "take this little plot of land."

With Jesus and the Holy Spirit, he has said "TAKE THE WORLD."
