SESSION 7 Turning Sneering into Cheering: Finding God in Circumstances

PREMISE

Throughout Moses' leadership, the people sneered at their circumstances. Yet, all along the way, God was providing. If they could have just recalled the circumstances He brought them through, they could have more easily seen that He was indeed leading them to a destiny. Sometimes identifying the monuments (moments of victory) and altars (moments of sin) along our journey can help us identify what God is doing in our lives. This can include hurts and pains, unexpected moments, in addition to the things we perceive as positive.
